**VERIFICATION OF PREPROFESSIONAL EDUCATION PROGRAM
SCHOOL/CHILD-RELATED ACTIVITIES**

Each pre-professional is required to attend one Pre-Professional Education Program orientation meeting or equivalent if on campus, and attend or participate in ONE school/child-related activity for each level of experience. Examples of the school/child-related activities include, but are not limited to, the following:

- school board meetings
- PTA meetings
- parent-teacher conferences
- teacher/department meetings
- conferences (California Reading Assn., etc.)
- inservice meetings
- community activities (exhibits of children's work, etc.)
- school plays
- school assemblies
- Open House.
- Interview one of the following people:
 - student
 - teacher
 - school administrator
 - counselor
 - librarian
 - secretary.
- Find out about a community agency which helps students:
 - Boys and Girls Club
 - Y.M.C.A., etc.
- Shadow a student.
- Observe a teacher other than your supervising teacher.

Requirements:

- Attend or participate in one activity for each 30 hours of P.E.P. experience OR different grade level, e.g., one for jr. high and one for high school if SST; one for primary grades and one for upper grades for MST.
- Word Process or fill out the **Activity Verification form** and return it with your completed Verification Agreement and Assessment Form.
- On the **Verification Agreement**, list the date and activity in the space provided.
