

# Centrally Administered Fellowship Opportunities & Information for Continuing Students

The following require departmental nomination:

## **Dean's Fellowship** - for doctoral students

Amount: For this 1-year award, the Graduate Division provides a stipend of \$16,000, plus payment of fees and health insurance for all awardees. Nonresident tuition is not included in the award package. Students may receive the fellowship twice during their academic careers, but must be re-nominated, as it is not an automatically renewable award.

## **Graduate Opportunity Fellowship (GOF)** - diversity fellowship for doctoral students

Amount: For this 1-year award, the Graduate Division provides a stipend of \$16,000, and payment of fees and health insurance for all awardees. Nonresident tuition is not provided as continuing students are expected to establish California residency by their second year. Students may receive the fellowship twice during their academic careers, but must be re-nominated, as it is not an automatically renewable award.

## **Brython Davis Graduate Fellowship**

For graduate students in good academic standing and registered or on leave of absence at the time of application, one of whose parents is or was a regular member of the United States Navy or Marine Corps.

## **Graduate Division Dissertation Awards**

Given to advanced graduate students in the final stages of writing the dissertation. Students receiving a dissertation award are not allowed to hold an academic apprentice appointment the quarter in which they receive this award. Students must be advanced to candidacy at the time they apply, and are expected to complete their degrees within the fellowship period. This is a one-time award. Students receiving this award will not be considered for further central fellowship awards.

## **Graduate Research Mentorship Program (GRMP)**

This diversity fellowship is available to continuing doctoral students who are not receiving other central fellowship support. Students who receive fellowships must have faculty mentors who will guide the students' research.

## **Humanities and Social Science Research Grants**

Grants may be used for travel or supplies, but not for stipend. If funded, students may reapply for the same award in future years.

## **Humanities Research Assistantships**

Intended for doctoral students from the humanities or fine arts, or who are conducting research of a humanistic nature. This award is intended to free the student from employment obligations, thus enabling full attention to research.

## **The James D. Kline Fund for International Studies Award**

Candidates pursuing a graduate degree at any UC campus and residing in any part of the world are eligible for this award. Funding is available for projects or programs of studies that promote international understanding and world peace. The Graduate Division provides matching funds for a UCSB student awardee.

### **President's Dissertation Year Fellowship**

This diversity fellowship is funded by the Office of the President and is designed for meritorious students who plan careers in academia. Students are also required to present their research at another UC campus; travel funds are provided for this purpose. Students must be advanced to candidacy at the time they are nominated, and are expected to complete their degrees within the fellowship period. Students receiving this award will not be considered for further central fellowship awards.

### **UCSB Affiliates Graduate Dissertation Fellowships**

The UCSB Affiliates is a community-based support group for the University of California, Santa Barbara. General Affiliates awards are to graduate students in any discipline who are advanced to Ph.D. candidacy and in the final stages of the degree. At least one fellowship is reserved to qualified graduate students whose research has an environmental focus. Another fellowship is generally designated for a qualified graduate student in Engineering. Also, there may be a fellowship targeted to a student in the arts or humanities. Awards are intended to assist student in the completion of their dissertations.

## **Additional Sources of Funding for Continuing Students**

### **Doctoral Student Travel Grants**

Available to students advanced to candidacy for doctoral, master's who have been invited to present a research paper at a scholarly meeting, or to give a performance, or to present the results of research before a distinguished audience. ### **Academic Senate Intercampus Exchange Travel Funds**

Graduate students at any level are eligible to apply for travel funding for one trip per year to any institution within the state of California (includes Stanford Library, Huntington Library and other non-UC sites, especially research libraries). ### **Interdisciplinary Humanities Center (IHC) Predoctoral Fellowships**

IHC grants are awarded to Doctoral students who have advanced to Ph.D. candidacy by the application deadline; advanced M.F.A. candidates may also apply. Each award will be in the amount of \$4,000. The stipend is to be taken during one quarter of the academic year, in lieu of all other campus fellowships and employment, for the purpose of devoting full-time work toward completing the degree.
