Fellowship Name	Fellowship Description
GGSE Alumni Fellowship Fund	<p>Fund to be used to support partial and/or full fellowships for deserving students in the GGSE's Education (EDUC) Department at the discretion of the Dean or designate of the Dean.</p>
Delaine A. Eastin Fellowship	<p>Fund established through a generous gift from Delaine A. Eastin, UCSB graduate with a MA in Political Science. Delaine had an accomplished career in politics and education; she represented parts of Alameda and Santa Clara counties in the California State Assembly and she served as the 25th California State Superintendent of Public Instruction.</p> <p>The purpose of the fund is to support qualified graduate students in the Department of Education and used to encourage first-in-family students to pursue an MA or PhD in Education. Recipients must show academic promise and be the first in their family to attend graduate school.</p>
Dr. Dorothy M. Chun Fellowship	<p>Fund established through a generous gift from Dorothy M. Chun and Joseph G. Polchinski. Dr. Chun is a current faculty member in GGSE's Education Department and her passion has been researching and exploring how second languages are learned and how technology can be leveraged to enhance the learning of language and culture. Dr. Polchinski is a Professor of Physics and a Permanent Member of the Kavli Institute for Theoretical Physics. He is best known for his discovery of D-branes, extended structures that appear to be central to the mathematics and physics of string theory.</p> <p>The purpose of the fund is to support qualified graduate students studying second language acquisition and closely-related topics. To be eligible, students must be enrolled in the interdisciplinary Emphasis in Applied Linguistics or pursuing research focused on enhancing multilingualism and multiculturalism.</p>
Phillip and Helen Green Fellowship	<p>Fund established through a generous gift from former Education Professor, Judith Green. Designed to support the Green family's commitment to quality public education and to equity of access for all students.</p> <p>The purpose of the fund is to support conference related travel for graduate students, with a preference for graduate students doing classroom research that supports democratic practices and equity of access for immigrant and second language students from working class backgrounds, with the purpose of finding practices that work and support students in gaining access to American society. Fellowships should be used to offset expenses related to recipients attending and presenting their work at professional research conferences, or to attend professional development workshops at professional research conferences and/or international universities. To be eligible for the travel fellowship, students must be (1) advanced to PhD candidacy, and (2) aligned with and employing an ethnographic and/or discourse based research approach.</p>

<p>James D. and Carol N. Dixon Graduate Fellowship</p>	<p>Fund established through a generous gift from James D. and Carol N. Dixon. Dr. Dixon is an emeriti faculty member of the Education Department who held the position of Associate Dean for many years, Director of GGSE's first reading clinic, co-Director of the South Coast Writing Project, and co-founder of the Santa Barbara Classroom Discourse Group. James Dixon worked for Honeywell in their theoretical physics/orbital mechanics group, taught high school mathematics and worked as a Sales Manager selling office equipment.</p> <p>The purpose of the fund is to support qualified MA or PhD graduate students in GGSE with a focus on reading and literacy or the broader field of literacy studies. When GGSE houses an active reading clinic, preference will be given to students who are involved in clinic activities.</p>
