<b>PRE-ADVANCEMENT REQUIREMENT</b>			
Each student must write and present a semi-independent research paper that is of publishable quality. This paper is typically completed by the Fall quarter of Year 3 and is included as one of the written products for the student's qualifying exam. In addition, the results of this research must be presented at the annual CCSP Research Festival the fall quarter of the year that the student aims to complete the qualifying exam.

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<b>Ph.D. QUALIFYING EXAMS/ ADVANCEMENT TO CANDIDACY</b>
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The Ph.D. qualifying exams consist of at least two written papers (e.g., theories and research) of publishable quality and an oral examination that covers clinical theories, research, and ethics.

The purpose of the qualifying examination is to demonstrate that a student has mastered the practical, ethical, and research skills related to their general area in addition to more extensive knowledge on a specialty topic that is often the focus of the student's research. The written examination must be completed before the oral examination, which is typically held at the end of the Fall quarter of Year 3. Students complete the requirements to Advance to Candidacy by the end of Year 4 (Year 3 if entering the program with a previous, relevant MA).

<b>PREDOCTORAL INTERNSHIP REQUIREMENTS</b>
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Students must complete a pre-doctoral internship that meets the course requirements for 279ABC. If a student is accepted to a non-APA approved internship, the CCSP Director of Clinical Training will negotiate an internship agreement with the site.
