Teacher Education Program **CREDENTIALS**

SPECIAL EDUCATION

"I want to be a special education teacher."

EDUCATION SPECIALIST Teaching Credential (ESC)

Teach students with Mild to Moderate, or Extensive Support Needs

SECONDARY

"I want to teach Jr. High or High School."

SINGLE SUBJECT Teaching Credential (SST)

Teach Jr. High or High School students in a single subject:

Science / Math / English / History, Social Science / World Languages

ELEMENTARY

"I want to be an Elementary school teacher."

MULTIPLE SUBJECT Teaching Credential (MST)

Teach grades K-8 in self-contained classrooms

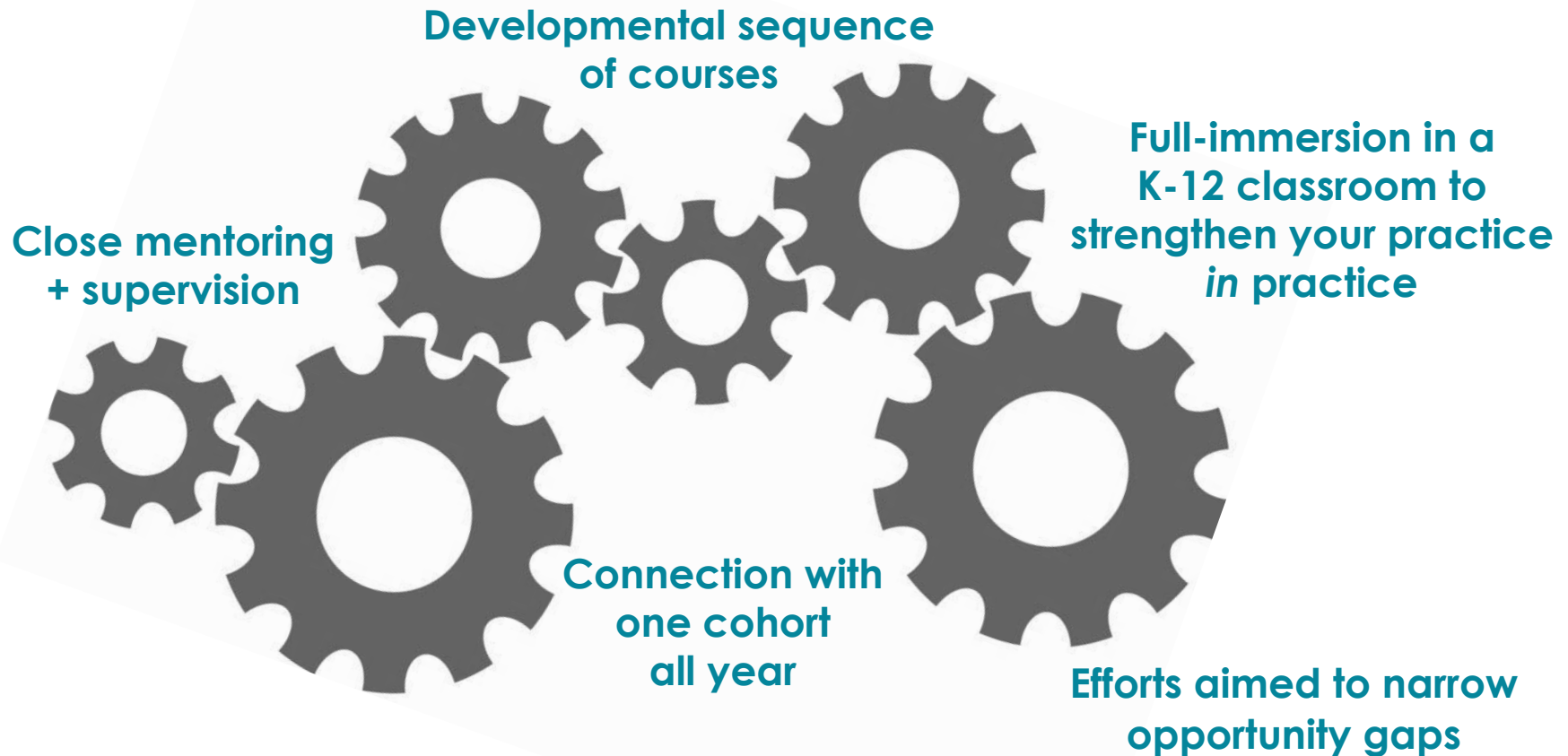

YEAR – AT – A – GLANCE

Summer

- UCSB** Foundational coursework, on campus all days of the week
- K-12 Schools** Student teaching begins mid-August

Fall

- UCSB** Coursework focuses on designing learning experiences for diverse learners
- K-12 Schools** Part-time student teaching
Grow from observing to taking over teaching for short period

Winter

- UCSB** Coursework focuses on observation and reflection of your teaching
- K-12 Schools** Part-time student teaching at a new placement, taking on more responsibility

Spring

- UCSB** Coursework focuses on developing as a professional educator
- K-12 Schools** Full-time student teaching

APPLICATION PROCESS

APPLICATION STEPS



1) Complete your application prerequisites

- ☐ Pre-professional Experience
- ☐ Basic Skills Requirement
- ☐ Subject Matter Requirement

2) Apply online via the eApp

3) Attend interviews

4) Complete other program/state requirements

2024 APPLICATION DEADLINE: TDB

(For attendance year 2024-25)

BASIC SKILLS REQUIREMENT

There are many ways to meet this requirement:

- CBEST exam
- SAT, ACT, or AP qualifying scores
- Qualifying Coursework

Deadline:

Proof of passage CBEST or completion of other option by **the Application Deadline**

SUBJECT MATTER REQUIREMENT

Meet this requirement via:

- CSET exams
- Undergraduate major
- Coursework evaluation

Deadline:

Proof of scheduled CSET or completion of other option by **the Application Deadline**
Proof of full completion by **July 1, 2024**

WHAT SHOULD I DO NOW?

1. Take some **Education classes**.
2. Earn **pre-professional hours**.
 - Some can be earned through courses, or email Katie Blackwell for assistance, kblackwell@education.ucsb.edu.
3. Develop relationships with professors and/or other mentors to write **letters of recommendation**.
4. Pass the **Basic Skills Requirement**.
5. Begin working on **Subject Matter Competency** tests.
 - There are ~3 exams for each [CSET](#) (the # varies by subject).
 - If needed, these tests are challenging and time consuming.
