As part of your preparation for becoming a teacher, we will provide you with experiences that challenge you to collect data and reflect upon your own practice. We will also ask for a careful analysis of your observations and experiences with individual children, classrooms, schools, and with the Teacher Education Program itself. In these activities, you will be beginning what we hope will be a lifelong habit of collecting and analyzing data to improve your understanding of the complex work of teaching.

During your time as a student in TEP, we will also be researching and evaluating our own practices. We do this to model our values and beliefs – but more fundamentally to improve the caliber of educational opportunities we provide to you (our students) and to build knowledge of potential benefit to the teaching profession.
